As you were made aware, Queen Emma had its Ofsted inspection carried out on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> June. This follows an inspection in October 2022 that was deemed 'unreliable' by Ofsted itself and that was subsequently removed from public access as a result. I am pleased to report that our most recent experience was more positive for staff and children and we feel it was a true reflection of life in our school. Whilst we cannot share the results until the final report is published, I would like to say the biggest 'thank you' on behalf of all staff for your perpetual support and words of encouragement (both written and verbal) that have helped us to stay positive and determined throughout this time. This is just a small gesture that represents the enormous appreciation that we have felt from our parenting community, our wider community and indeed nationally. I think this shows what a remarkable place Queen Emma is.

Despite the twists and turns of this academic year, the staff in our school have strived to remain focused on school improvement and have not lost sight of the purpose of our work – educating and nurturing your children, together with you. We hope that this newsletter will show you that in spite of the storm, we have held our heads high to continue to educate your children to the best of our abilities.

The end of the summer term has been adventurous, active and enjoyable, whilst also filled with new learning milestones for our children. It was lovely to see so many families who were able to attend our sports days. This was a great mixture of team work and healthy competitive spirit.
