


### Attendance Matters

### **Nursery & Reception**



### Cubs

This half term the Cubs have been reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'Jaspers Beanstalk'. We planted sunflower seeds and beans in the class room before sending them home for you to all enjoy in your gardens. We also planted some in our outside growing area. We have also been learning about minibeasts. As a whole group we walked to the woodland explorers area and made bug hotels using natural materials.

### Foxes

This half term Foxes Class has been learning about 'Growing' and 'People who Help Us'. The children have planted runner beans and sunflower seeds, thinking about the conditions needed for life - water, sunlight and soil. They have looked at the artist Van Gogh and his famous painting 'Sunflowers,' from this the children have created their own observational paintings of sunflowers. We have enjoyed having a Dentist and Vet's Practice set up in the classroom, where the children have loved 'getting in role' whilst learning about caring for teeth and animals. Many cuddly animals have been 'treated' in the vets and many dolls had their teeth examined in the dentist! The children have gained a clear understanding of the need to clean their teeth regularly and to not eat too many foods containing sugar. We have also enjoyed listening for rhymes in the fun 'Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy' stories (L. Dodd). We now wish a happy half term to our foxes and their families!







In Owl Class, the children have had a great half term with our new class chicks. We started the half-term by putting eggs into an incubator which then took twenty one days to hatch! After twenty one days, we made a home for the chicks using shredded paper, a water tray, food tray and a special heat lamp to keep them warm. On the 19th day, we saw little cracks and watched a chick arrive. Overnight, a further three arrived. We had to wait until the chicks were all fluffy for them to then be taken out of the incubator and into their new home. The children have been very careful with the chicks and made sure they are always looked after. They have fed them every day, changed their bedding, and carefully stroked them when they came out of their house. During half-term, they will go to a farm to grow up with other chickens!

### Key Stage 1



### Dolphin

We have had a lovely half term exploring nature in Dolphin Class. In Science, we have studied the structure of plants and trees. We enjoyed planting a sunflower seed and thinking about the things it needed to help it grow. During our English lessons, we have been learning about the lifecycle of animals, such as frogs and butterflies. It was very exciting having some tadpoles visit the classroom. We observed them closely to look for any signs of them changing into froglets. In our Art lessons, we have been developing our painting skills by looking at the different marks paintbrushes make and how we can mix primary colours to make secondary ones. We used these skills to create a piece of art based on Paul Klee's 'Castle and Sun'.

### Seahorse

We have really enjoyed our journey through nature! In English, we wrote poetry inspired by 'Fern' and found out about explanation texts through the lifecycles of frogs and butterflies! In Science, we looked around us to identify and describe plants and trees. In Mathematics, we have applied what we know of number bonds within ten to adding and subtracting within twenty. Finally, in Art, we had fun exploring primary and secondary colours to create wonderful artwork inspired by 'Castle and Sun' by Paul Klee.





# Penguin

What another exciting term it has been in Penguin Class. The children have fully immersed themselves in our History topic and been great 'History Detectives' by investigating the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. In Mathematics, we have worked on money and fractions, the children have been fantastic in both of these tricky concepts. In English, we created fact files on monsters, which included expanded noun phrases and subordinating conjunctions. Finally, in Art and Design, the children have investigated and manipulated clay to create their own clay animals.

### Polar Bear

Polar Bear Class loved travelling back in time during our 'History Detectives' topic to find out about the life and work of two significant people: Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. In Mathematics, we immersed ourselves in learning about money and fractions. We had fun in Art exploring clay, learning the different techniques, such as rolling, pinching, squeezing and twisting, and then planning, making and evaluating our own clay animal! We have really enjoyed being outside for our 'Woodland Explorer' sessions too!



#### Middle Years



### Macaw

Macaw Class have had a busy term with their Design and Technology topic, learning all about levers and linkages. In Mathematics, they have been reasoning multiplicatively making connections between multiplication and division and using their resources to represent the different division structures. As scientists, they have been working scientifically to understand about light and dark and everybody loved Earth Day!

### Toucan

Toucan Class have had an incredibly busy half term, they developed their multiplication and division skills in Mathematics. In English, they wrote fantastic narratives based on 'Theseus and the Minotaur' and have just begun a poetry unit based on 'The Sound Collector'. During Science lessons, they have investigated light and dark and can explain how shadows are formed. They also enjoyed getting outside and drawing nature as part of our Earth Day activities. Finally, they got creative in Design and Technology making and designing their own toys with moving flags using levers and linkages.



### Falcon



Falcon Class have had an interesting term learning about the differences and similarities between East Anglia and California for our Geography topic. They looked at the physical and human differences between the two places. In English they have evaluated trip reviews and have made their own 'Trip Advisor' style review about our trip to the Scott Polar Museum. In Art, the children have been learning about the environmental artist Andy Goldsworthy. They have also been learning about the myth of the 'Green Man' and have made clay plaques of his face. We are looking forward to our next topic which is 'The Golden Age of Islam'.

## Kestrel

Kestrel Class have had a very busy half term! We have written journey stories in English, using adventurous expanded noun phrases to add interest to descriptions. In Mathematics, we have continued to develop our skills by working on converting mixed numbers and improper fractions. We have continued to learn about electricity in Science. In Art, we have used pencil drawing and shading techniques to produce work on the theme of nature. In Physical Education., we have been developing skills in tennis and athletics. We also enjoyed performing our Class Assembly to our parents and KS2.



#### **Later Years**



## Giraffe

Giraffe Class have loved continuing our study of mountains, and applying our knowledge to cross-curricular writing! We wrote poems based on an adventure to the ridge of a mountain range; focusing on using poetic techniques and devices. Our favourite part was using personification to make the mountain seems frightening and tall! We continued this into our next unit of writing: a non chronological report on how to survive climbing a mountain. We have been busy writing packing lists and exploring the local wildlife that we might find in order to give the best advice to our readers.

### Zebra

Although it has been a short half term it has also been a busy one! Zebra Class have been "On Top of the World". We have moved on from rivers last term to studying mountains this term. We have been writing fantastic descriptions and poems about mountains as well as a helpful guide to what you might you need if you were to climb a mountain! In Mathematics, we have continued our work on fractions and decimals. In Science, we have been looking at living things and habitats. We have also enjoyed cricket and athletics, particularly practising our Relay Skills! We enjoyed our visit to the Literature Festival on Wednesday to listen to the author Patrice Lawrence.



# Jaguar



We have made it through half of the summer term and it has definitely been busy! The most unforgettable part of the term has almost certainly been the SATs tests, which we have had in the back of our minds since September. Our revision sessions have helped us to better understand the process before facing the tests themselves. Our students have taken these challenges in their stride by pushing through, even when feeling the pressure. We are all incredibly proud of the work they have put in to prepare themselves. They have truly earned their break!

### Panther

Bikeability has become a familiar focus for Year Sixes and one they look forward to following SATs week. This is a rigorous programme that pushes the students' knowledge of road safety to the limit, while strongly encouraging confidence, leadership and focus while biking on the road - something we know that Cambridge holds in high regard. Well done to the students who powered through the four-day course and attained their certification for road-worthiness.



### Friendship Games

On 7 May, pupils from Year 2 enjoyed attending a sporting event at Coleridge Community College. They took part in various activities involving ball skills and agility. All the pupils had a fantastic time trying out the sports and finding new ways of keeping themselves active.

### School Uniform

Our children are doing so well with following uniform expectations at the moment, so let's keep up the efforts. We are aware that towards the end of the year, some families can tend to veer away from uniform expectations, however please be reassured that the expectation remain in place for all children.

Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts

Blue and white checked summer dress

Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan

Pale blue polo shirt

Black shoes or black trainers

White, black or grey socks / tights

Leggings may be worn instead of tights, but not instead of trousers

### PE Kit

Children need plain black shorts, a white t-shirt and plimsolls/trainers. Depending on the weather, children will also need a tracksuit and trainers for outdoor games lessons. Children will arrive in their PE kits, when it is their PE day.

### Jewellery

Jewellery may not be worn in school. The only exceptions are watches, studs for pierced ears, and cultural or religious adornments, which must be removed during lessons involving physical exercise. If such items cannot be removed the individual is not prepared in an acceptably safe way and cannot continue as is, so must take part in modified activity. The school will not accept responsibility for removing or storing studs. Long hair should be tied back for PE and DT activities.

### Cycles and Scooters

Please be reminded that scooters and cycles **MUST** be dismounted before entering the school grounds, by both adults and children. **Please do not be tempted to prop up cycles against the fences along our pedestrian pathways.** This presents a danger to those using the path, particularly young children. Please park cycles in the dedicated spaces, even if you are just dropping off or collecting a child. This will reduce the risk of cycles falling over and potentially injuring passers by.



Please ensure that you continue to think about our children and community by parking considerately. We liaise regularly with the parking control team and notify them of any concerns we might have. It is not acceptable to park on the zig zag lines or to use the entrance to the school as a drop off point. This creates a danger for our families and children. We receive a significant number of e-mails from upset local residents, informing us of parents/carers who block driveways or park illegally. This takes up a large amount of time to manage, so your co-operation in parking lawfully and mindfully is appreciated.

If your financial circumstances have been affected by the COVID 19 crisis you could now be entitled to Benefit Related Free School Meals (FSM). Not only will this provide an allocation of £2.50 per day towards food and drink at school, it also allows the school to benefit from additional funding for a period of up to five years.

#### Am I eligible?

You are eligible for this if you are receiving any of:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (unless you're also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and earn no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop receiving Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)

If in doubt, please fill out the simple online application form at

where you will receive an instant response as to your eligibility status. If you are eligible for FSM your child's school will be informed within 3 days.



#### **ELIGIBILTY CRITERIA**

- A maximum of £250 to be awarded per family, which could be used to pay or contribute towards enabling a child (or multiple children in a family) to participate in a formalised physical activity programme or swimming lessons.
- The child must be aged between 4 16 years old.
- The residing parent/guardian must be in receipt of income support or universal credit.
   (child benefit is not included in the eligibility criteria)
- . The child must live within the boundaries of Cambridge City.
- This grant is to provide the opportunity for a child to begin an activity or to sustain participation in an existing activity at grassroots level.
- In situations where the family's financial circumstances have changed, the grant can fund existing activity.
- Families can apply for repeated years, as long as there is a continued need for financial support.

#### WHAT THE GRANT CAN FUND

- The grant can be used towards annual subscriptions, (e.g. football / netball subs) session fees (e.g. ballet classes
  / swimming lessons)
- . The activity must be part of a programmed framework led by a club or organisation.
- Upon a successful grant application, all monies will be paid directly to the club or organisation and not to the family.
- . The grant does not cover one to one sessions, small private groups or gym memberships.
- The grant does not cover after school activities or one off camps.
- The fund does not cover travel expenses.
- priority is given to children who currently do no after school sport/physical activity due to the family's financial restrictions
