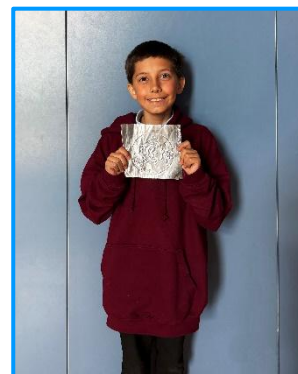
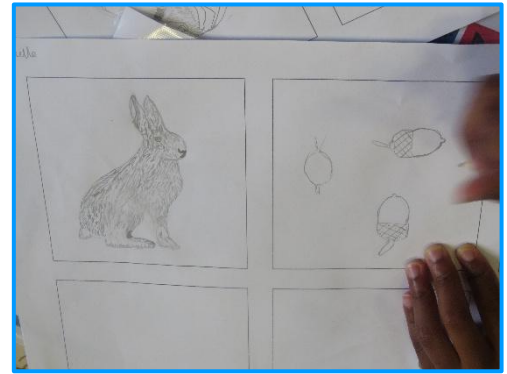

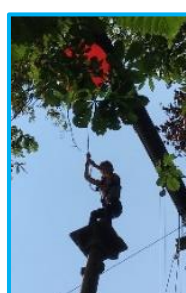

A selection of children from Years 5 and 6 at Queen Edith and Year 6 at Queen Emma were chosen to work with him on a permanent art feature that will be accommodated on this new development. Our children have worked with David in creating a legacy to the area, which included consideration about the local history, myths and biodiversity of that particular part of Cambridge. Nursery and Reception



Cubs



We have had a fun filled term with many different arts, crafts and stories. The children really enjoyed our topic 'Moving On Up'. We have read lots of stories including 'Aliens Love Under Pants', 'Stop That Dinosaur', 'Elmer and the Lost Teddy', 'Travel and Holidays', 'Under the Sea' and 'You Choose'. We have also had a great time outside drawing with chalks and playing in the water.

Foxes

This half term in Foxes we have focused on 'size, length, weight and capacity' - learning about the big, medium and small Billy Goats Gruff goats, the strength of the Three Little Pigs' straw, stick and brick houses and whether objects float or sink in water. We have made tin foil and playdough boats to use in the water tray and created rainbow fish using shiny papers. We have enjoyed the story of 'The Rainbow Fish' and discussed the morale of the story, that being kind and sharing shiny scales made the rainbow fish feel happy. We will finish the year with a lovely Graduation Celebration and now wish all our Foxes children and families a very happy summer break.



Owl

This half term, we have been on our school trip to Boydell's Farm. We got to see lots of different animals including sheep, goats, chicks, cows, cats, dogs, pigs and horses. We started our trip by milking a cow, feeding lots of large farm animals including a four week old Alpaca which Owl Class loved. We then met some small farmyard animals including a bunny, guinea pig and chicks before watching Farmer Keily shear a very naughty sheep! We all loved our trip and were so excited with our farmyard animal masks that we could take home to remind us all about our amazing trip!





Dolphin



Dolphin Class loved having volunteers from AstraZeneca visit to teach us about different ways of measuring. We then enjoyed using the pipettes to create pictures with coloured water. In Physical Education we developed our team work skills by playing games and working on challenges together. A definite highlight, was watching the class caterpillars transform into butterflies. Our Art lessons left us with some messy hands as we explored different ways of printing to create repeated and overlapping patterns. We loved taking the Traditional Tale of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and writing our own versions by changing the characters. After finding the remains of a picnic in the class one Monday morning, we had to use our detective skills to discover which book character might have visited the classroom while we were at home.

Seahorse

'Food, Glorious Food' has been wonderful finale to our year. In English, we enjoyed writing our own imaginative versions of the Three Billy Goats Gruff story. We had fun writing thank you letters inspired by 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' and we made masks to pretend to be greedy tigers! In Mathematics, we learnt to identify and add coins; plus, how to use the language of time and tell the time to o'clock and half past the hour. Penguin



Penguin Class have had a busy final term in Year 2 learning about Beijing and comparing its human and physical features with Cambridge. In English, the children have written their own adventure stories based on the book, 'Meerkat Mail'. In Mathematics, they have worked really hard on learning to tell the time to the nearest five minutes, whilst also revisiting concepts taught throughout the year. To complete their wonderful year in Year 2, they made hand puppets in Design and Technology and worked in groups to prepare a small performance using their hand puppets. They have all worked so hard this year and should be super proud of themselves!

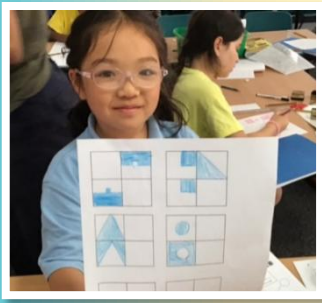
Polar Bear

We really enjoyed our 'Journey to the East' and had great fun in Geography comparing Cambridge and Beijing. In Mathematics, we explored position, direction, mass, capacity and volume; we also completed our work on multiplication and division. In English, we wrote fantastic adventure stories based on 'Meerkat Mail'. To finish off our year we had a fantastic trip to Shepreth Wildlife Park where the children particularly liked seeing the meerkats in their natural environment and listened to a really interesting talk by a wildlife keeper on camouflage. Well done to everyone in Polar Bear Class this year for all your hard work.





Macaw



It has been another busy term in Macaw Class, learning all about plants. The children loved their visit to Wandlebury and all the wonderful activities they were able to experience. In Mathematics, the children have been learning all about fractions and they have really enjoyed finding different ways to represent fractions. In Art, the children have been experimenting with secondary and tertiary colours and learning how to use black and white to create shades and tints.

Toucan

What a fabulous final half term we have had together. The children have been inspired by Claude Monet and have created wonderful paintings having learnt how to mix secondary and tertiary colours using powder paint. In Mathematics, the children have explored both unit and non-unit fractions. They also enjoyed our Science trip to Wandlebury, where the children immersed themselves in nature. The children have all worked incredibly this year and should be very proud of themselves, it has been a pleasure to teach them - superstars!



Falcon



Falcon Class visited the Mosque in Cambridge as part of their religious learning this year. They noticed lots of design features that we have been discussing in school including the geometric patterns, the crescent moon and eight pointed stars. Children saw the washrooms, where Muslims wash before praying; the mirhab, which shows the direction of Mecca and the clocks which tell Muslims when it is time to pray. They have also learnt how to make flatbreads in Design and Technology and enjoyed eating them! In English, we wrote stories from another culture based on a model text and used lots of exciting language to make them enjoyable to read. In Physical Education Falcon Class practiced their rounder skills and in Science they have been looking for mini-beasts and identifying them.

Kestrel

Kestrel Class have had a very busy half term! In English, we have written information texts about the city of Baghdad and worked on a story from another culture. In Mathematics, we have worked on naming and measuring angles and converting 12 and 24 hour time. We have learnt about animal habitats in Science and during Physical Education we have been developing skills in basketball and rounders. We have made animations in Computing and continued to learn to play the recorder in our Music lessons.





Giraffe



Giraffe Class has had a wonderful term and have shown their readiness for moving up to Year 6. They have flourished in their writing this term; demonstrating their ability to write for a range of purposes. Their Mountaineer Survival Guide showed their ability use formal tone, a range of organisation devices for a non-fiction text and use semi colons and colons correctly. Moreover, in contrast, their narratives for Year 2 showed their ability to write informally for a younger audience and alter their tone to entertain their reader. They have also thoroughly enjoyed their Friday Vests tasks, which have taught the children how to work collaboratively in order to problem solve.

We are coming to the end of our final half term in Year 5 and it's been another very busy one. Looking back there are many highlights! Swimming lessons, which have been great fun. We made scones as part of our Design and Technology topic on Seasonal food and everyone agreed they were delicious, particularly with strawberry jam and fresh strawberries! We were in a Comic Jam when Emmeline's Dad came to do an artist's workshop with us. We had a visit from a theatre company who presented 'The Railway Children' and we all had a fantastic time at Sports Day. Panther

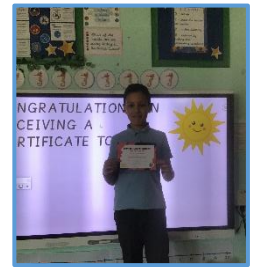

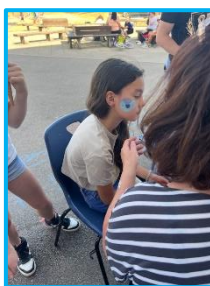

School Uniform

Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts

Blue and white checked summer dress

Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan

Pale blue polo shirt

Black shoes or black trainers (children in Years 5 and 6 require a pair of black indoor shoes (often plimsolls))

White, black or grey socks / tights

Leggings may be worn instead of tights, but not instead of trousers

PE Kit

Children need plain black shorts, a white t-shirt and plimsolls/trainers. Depending on the weather, children will also need a tracksuit and trainers for outdoor games lessons. Children will continue to arrive in their PE kits, when it is their PE day.

Jewellery

Jewellery may not be worn in school. The only exceptions are watches, studs for pierced ears, and cultural or religious adornments, which must be removed during lessons involving physical exercise. If such items cannot be removed the individual is not prepared in an acceptably safe way and cannot continue as is, so must take part in modified activity. The school will not accept responsibility for removing or storing studs. Long hair should be tied back for PE and DT activities.

Pupil Mobile Phones

For pupils who need to bring a mobile phone to school, please observe and support our policy around this. Pupils are asked to switch off their mobile phones **PRIOR** to entering the school site i.e. before coming onto the school grounds. All mobiles must then be handed in at the school office before going into classrooms. Mobile phones may be collected by the child or their parent at the end of the school day and may be switched on after leaving the premises. This minimises the risks for children whilst they are in school. Children who are accompanied to and from school have no requirement for a mobile phone in school.

Cycles and Scooters

Please be reminded that scooters and cycles **MUST** be dismantled before entering the school grounds, by both adults and children. **Please do not be tempted to prop up cycles against the fences along our pedestrian pathways.** This presents a danger to those using the path, particularly young children. Please park cycles in the dedicated spaces, even if you are just dropping off or collecting a child. This will reduce the risk of cycles falling over and potentially injuring passers by.

Parking

Please ensure that you continue to think about our children and community by parking considerately. We liaise regularly with the parking control team and notify them of any concerns we might have. It is not acceptable to park on the zig zag lines or to use the entrance to the school as a drop off point. This creates a danger for our families and children. We receive a significant number of e-mails from upset local residents, informing us of parents/carers who block driveways or park illegally. This takes up a large amount of time to manage, so your co-operation in parking lawfully and mindfully is appreciated.

School Meal Changes

From September, our school catering providers Aspens, will be using a different system to process School Meals orders.

The new Swift system will enable ordering via an app as well as online ordering. Service at lunchtime will be improved with all orders and allergy information being given to the kitchen in real time by way of tablet computers. This change will require payments to be made to the new Swift system, so please run down any credit on your child's existing Select account. Should you have any credit left on your child's account, you will need to contact Select directly who will organise a refund for you.

More details about the new Swift system will be sent home soon.

If your child is currently in Year 2 and moving into Year 3, they will no longer be eligible for universal free school meals. When they return in September you will need to pay £2.75 if your child chooses to have a school lunch.

We will return to school on Week 2 of the current menu.



Am I eligible?

You are eligible for this if you are receiving any of:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (unless you're also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and earn no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop receiving Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)

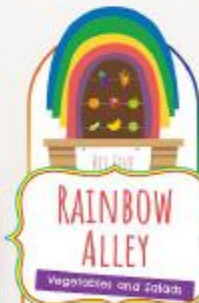
