Dear Parents and Carers

As we hurtle towards Christmas, it is time to reflect upon the wide range of opportunities that have been open to our children and families this half term. We have continued to support children in aiming high to try and achieve our whole school WIG (wildly important goal) that was set in September. This goal was for children to read at least 5 times per week at home. We set a target for 80% of children to achieve this, but we managed only 58%. Reading is a fundamental skills that needs daily practice in order for children to access all other areas of the curriculum, so as a valued partner in educating your child/ren, your help with this has been appreciated, but as you can see, there is more to do. Time constraints due to the busy lives we lead can often be a reason to leave hearing children read to the bottom of our 'to do' lists. However, even sparing 10 minutes a day to hear your child read, can be really beneficial.

Following a hibernation period, we are looking forward to welcoming 2 new pets to Queen Emma. Our new tortoises, who are called Leo and Teddy, will be joining us in the Spring and will be based in Dolphin Class. We are used to seeing our mentor dog, Ozzy, roaming around the school now and our tortoises will provide a new and slower dynamic! Children will be able to learn how to care for the tortoises and will understand their needs, appreciating that it takes commitment, respect and compassion to think about the necessities of others. We look forward to welcoming them into our school.



The annual cross country event took place for children in Years 3, 5 and 6 once again this term. The children selected were required to run the 1500 metre long distance track, alongside competitors from other local schools, with their peers and staff cheering them on from the sidelines. This was no easy feat, with children tackling the uphill stretch with grit and determination. Each year group completed their run, ending with a smile on their faces, and I was amazed to see that some of them were barely out of breath! It was a terrific effort from our children, who upheld our school values throughout the entire morning.

We are pleased to inform you that the swimming pool at Queen Edith, used by the Queen Emma children in Years 5 and 6 during the Summer term, will be back up and running this academic year. The cost of maintaining and heating the pool for lessons is only increasing. We will therefore be requesting voluntary donations from families when swimming lessons are resumed to help us meet these costs. A block of lessons (usually 6-7 weeks) will be £10 per child with a maximum cap of £20 per family. Having researched local offers, we feel this is reasonable. More information will be sent to you about this, if your child is due to swim in the Summer term.

The Queen Emma Christmas Fayre was another wonderful event, organised by our remarkable volunteers and staff from the PSFA. It was clear to see how much enjoyment was gleaned from the activities on offer by the children and families who were able to attend, so their efforts were truly appreciated. Thank you for supporting this event. As you may know, the PSFA are losing members at the end of the year and will require positions to be filled in order to remain

sustainable. Please let the school office know if you would be interested in joining a brilliant part of our school and they will be happy to pass on your details to the relevant person.









Our children delighted their audiences recently, as Key Stage 1 children, Reception children and nursery children took to the stage to perform deliver their much anticipated Christmas performances. Children in the nursery brought smiles to the faces of their family members by singing a medley of festive tunes that were accompanied by actions they had learned. Our little Christmas trees and snowflakes joined together to perform a magical dance, that was enjoyed by us all. Those in Reception took a journey around the world to help us think about how Christmas is celebrated in other countries. Their enthusiasm for singing was clear for us all to see as they boarded their sleigh to the North Pole for a wonderful journey to see Father Christmas himself. Children in Key Stage 1 reminded us of how important kindness is at this time of the year. We heard a tale based around our very own caretaker, Mr Jenkins, and how hard he worked to make Christmas special. In return, one particular thoughtful child, decided to repay his good deeds.

Our children performed with the upmost zeal and I hope that anyone who attended, thoroughly enjoyed seeing their child/ren do their very best. Staff at the school worked very hard to ensure that the children did each performance justice, so thank you to all of them for their tireless work.

We have had to say goodbye to a few Governors this term, but I am glad to say we have been able to welcome a number of new faces to the Governing Body. Richard Baldwin joins us from AstraZeneca with a wealth of experience in finance. Marsha Merchant was co-opted onto the Governing Body at our meeting on 2nd December: she is a parent at Queen Edith has wide experience in finance and accountancy. Ana Toste Rego is our new elected Parent Governor for Queen Edith; she has experience in scientific research as well as voluntary work with young children. The breadth of experience of our Governing Body is a tremendous source of strength and I am delighted to have such a strong injection of talent. They all very warmly welcomed.

You will be aware that a combination of financial pressures and a downfall in the birth rate has meant we have had to reduce Queen Emma to one-form entry for this year and next; we hope that the expansion of the city will allow the school to go back to two-form entry and we are keeping a close eye on the developments in our area. Staff have managed the change very successfully but we continue to monitor the impact of the change on all aspects of the children's learning and experience.

In line with the government's drive to raise attendance nationally, the Governors recently approved a new Attendance Policy. Many parents have queries about when they can legitimately take children out of school, when they can't and what the consequences might be if they do. You will have heard many times about the crucial importance of attendance, which includes arriving for school on time, and the serious impact a poor attendance record can have on a child's future prospects. I would encourage you to have a look at the new Attendance Policy, which is posted on the Federation website and where I hope you will find answers to any queries you might have.

We had fun Christmas celebrations and we now wish all our families a wonderful Christmas.







During December, we have been having lots of Christmas fun. The main part of our half term has been learning and preparing for our Christmas Performance 'Christmas around the world'. After all of our hard work, we performed to KS1 and siblings as a dress rehearsal before performing to our parents. Dolphin Class have had a busy and fun half term learning about space related. In Art, we have been practising our sketching skills and looked in detail at Georgia O'Keeffe and drew our own pictures in the same style. In Science we designed, made, and tested a pet house to see which waterproof materials were suitable for the roof. Another very busy but enjoyable half term!

This half term in Polar Bear Class, the children have enjoyed exploring a range of materials and their purposes. In Forest School, we used natural dyes such as turmeric and cumin to draw pictures with sticks. During our science sessions, we explored the difference between the properties and purposes of materials, asking the question 'Why is this material suitable for its purpose?'

Macaw Class have loved learning all about pre-history and had a fantastic experience when they travelled back in time during their Stone Age day! They have enjoyed writing their own adventure stories based on the book, "Stone Age Boy," and have enjoyed creating their very own cave paintings.

Toucan

Toucan Class have worked incredibly hard this term, they have enjoyed being immersed in the Stone Age. They have written exciting stories based upon 'The Stone Age Boy', used historical sources to investigate life in Pre-history and wrote instructions to catch a Stone Age creature that was destroying our playground!



Falcon

Falcon Class have had a busy half termand have learnt alot!In Computing we have had some of the engineers from ARM join us with robots to program using the BBC micro bits which they really enjoyed! In Science they have been learning all about sound and have participated in sound experiments. In Mathematics the children have continued to learn their times tables, especially their 3 and 6 times tables. In Design and Technology we have designed and made felt decorations by sewing them and decorating with sequins.

Kestrel

Kestrel Class have had a very busy half term! We have worked hard writing myths based upon our Roman topic. We have also calculated the perimeter of 2d shapes in Mathematics and developed times tables knowledge. After studying the space landscape art of Peter Thorpe, we have produced some incredible space scenes. These will be on view in the corridor outside our classroom after Christmas. Our learning culminated in a fantastic 'Wonder dome' experience, where we enjoyed the thrills of space travel from inside an inflatable planetarium. We hope you enjoyed celebrating with us in our class assembly too, we loved performing in front of our friends and families!

Zebra

This half term Zebra Class has enjoyed learning all about Earth and Space! In our Science lessons, we made models to demonstrate our understanding of how the Earth orbits around the Sun and why the Moon appears to change shape in the sky. We loved investigating different time zones and finding out why different parts of the world experience day and night at different times. In English, we used information books and the iPads to research our chosen planet and then we worked hard to write an informative non-chronological report. Once we had published our reports, we enjoyed spending time reading each other's to find out more!

Reminder

Please be reminded that scooters and cycles MUST be dismounted before entering the school grounds, by both adults and children. We have noticed an increase in the number of cycles that are being propped up against the fences along our pedestrian pathways. This presents a danger to those using the path, particularly young children. Please park cycles in the dedicated spaces, even if you are just dropping off or collecting a child. This will reduce the risk of cycles falling over and potentially injuring passers by.

Parking

Now that the evenings are going to become darker earlier and the weather has turned colder and wetter, please ensure that you continue to think about our children and community by parking considerately. We liaise regularly with the parking control team and notify them of any concerns we might have. It is not acceptable to park on the zig zag lines or to use the entrance to the school as a drop off point. This creates a danger for our families and children



Jewellery

Jewellery may not be worn in school. The only exceptions are watches, studs for pierced ears, and cultural or religious adornments, which must be removed during lessons involving physical exercise. If such items cannot be removed the individual is not prepared in an acceptably safe way and cannot continue as is, so must take part in modified activity. The school will not accept responsibility for removing or storing studs. Long hair should be tied back for PE and DT activities.

Am I eligible?

You are eligible for this if you are receiving any of:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (unless you're also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and earn no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop receiving Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)

where you will receive an instant response as to your eligibility status. If you are eligible for FSM your child's school will be informed within 3 days.
