What would you see? What would you hear?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">MATHEMATICS</p> <p>If you climbed the 10 highest peaks in the world how many metres would you have climbed? Show each step using correct mathematical methods.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">DESIGN and TECHNOLOGY</p> <p>Create a meal that would provide the essential energy required for a mountain hike. Or make an energy bar. Ask your family to comment on your creation.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">OUT AND ABOUT</p> <p>Enjoy a riverside or hilltop walk with your family. Before your outing, explore the area using an Ordnance Survey map and examine the contour lines, grid references and other features.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">ENGLISH</p> <p>Write an adventure story set on a mountain. Make sure your reader is emotionally involved in the story. Use a range of devices to create tension and suspense too.</p>

You could paint, draw with pencil crayons, use oil pastels, use a computer programme 'paint' or any medium you prefer.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">GEOGRAPHY</p> <p>Choose three mountains from a world map. Use your research skills to find out more about these mountains and create an information table to record your findings. Include each mountain's name, location, features and fascinating facts.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">GEOGRAPHY</p> <p>Investigate how mountains are formed. Put this information into your own words and make an information poster or a fact file. Investigate fold, dome, volcanic and block mountains!</p>
