Imagine you are visiting Kenya. Tell Giraffe Class about the landscape, the animals and all the wonderful things you have seen.</p>	<p>MATHEMATICS</p> <p>If you climbed the 10 highest peaks in the world how many metres would you have climbed? Show each step using correct mathematical methods.</p>
<p>ENGLISH</p> <p>Listen to an African savannah on YouTube. Close your eyes and pretend you are there. Write a descriptive paragraph about what you can see, hear, feel and smell.</p>	<p>OUT AND ABOUT</p> <p>Enjoy a riverside or hilltop walk with your family. Before your outing, explore the area using an Ordnance Survey map and examine the contour lines, grid references and other features.</p>	<p>ENGLISH</p> <p>Create an acrostic poem about an African animal.</p> <p>Look at the examples on the back of this sheet for inspiration!</p>
<p>GEOGRAPHY</p> <p>Use your research skills to find out facts about Mount Kilimanjaro – the highest mountain in Africa. Create an information table to record your findings.</p>	<p>ART and DESIGN</p> <p>Create a piece of African inspired art. You could make a mask or a tribal necklace!</p>	<p>GEOGRAPHY</p> <p>Look at a map of Africa and identify each country.</p> <p>Investigate the climate of Africa and key physical and human features.</p> <p>Which animals are native to Africa?</p>
