Which challenges will you choose to complete?

RESEARCH TASK

Research survival techniques, clothing worn and food eaten by mountaineers.

You could research famous mountaineers too.

ENGLISH

Listen to an African savannah on YouTube. Close your eyes and pretend you are there. Write a descriptive paragraph about what you can see, hear, feel and smell.

GEOGRAPHY

Use your research skills to find out facts about Mount
Kilimanjaro – the highest mountain in Africa. Create an information table to record your findings.

ENGLISH

Send Giraffe Class a postcard. Imagine you are visiting Kenya. Tell Giraffe Class about the landscape, the animals and all the wonderful things you have seen.

OUT AND ABOUT

Enjoy a riverside or hilltop walk with your family. Before your outing, explore the area using an Ordnance Survey map and examine the contour lines, grid references and other features.

ART and DESIGN

Create a piece of African inspired art. You could make a mask or a tribal necklace!

MATHEMATICS

If you climbed the 10 highest peaks in the world how many metres would you have climbed? Show each step using correct mathematical methods.

ENGLISH

Create an acrostic poem about an African animal.

GEOGRAPHY

Look at a map of Africa and identify each country.

Investigate the climate of Africa and key physical and human features.

Which animals are native to Africa?
